Measure A Job/Career Training Bond Act -- Siskiyou Joint Community College District

130 / **56.28% Yes** votes 101 / **43.72% No** votes

To train and prepare students for jobs, careers and transfer to four-year universities, expand nursing, medical training, fire science and technology skills programs

- Build/renovate libraries, classrooms for healthcare, science, computer/job training programs;
- Acquire, construct, modernize and equip facilities,
- Repair, upgrade deteriorating classrooms, restrooms, plumbing, electrical systems,

Shall Siskiyou Joint Community College District qualify for State matching funds, and issue \$31,400,000 in bonds, at legal rates, with citizen oversight, annual audits and no money for administrators' salaries?

Measure B Fee Increase -- Burney Water District

699 / **66.70% Yes** votes 349 / **33.30% No** votes

Shall the Burney Water District increase the existing pool fee from \$2.00 per month to \$4.00 per month for the purpose of maintaining, operating, and repairing of the public swimming pool facility? Annually, the fee may be reduced following review by the Burney Water District's resident oversight committee, should adequate reserves exist. Additionally, the board of Directors of the Burney Water District shall have the authority to raise the fee up to and no more than \$1.00 every five years after a financial review by the same committee."
